

Resilience

Resilience in a positive way.

It does not always mean "overcoming" difficulties, but also learning from them and growing from those experiences. Resilient people are not easily overcome by challenges, but look for ways to cope with them and learn from them in order to move on with their lives.

Resilience is not something a person is born with, but develops over time through life experiences, relationships and learning.

Resilience can be examined along the following dimensions:

- Emotional dimension: the ability to manage emotions in adverse situations.
- Cognitive dimension: the ability to maintain a positive and optimistic attitude when seeking solutions.
- Social dimension: the ability to seek support from others and maintain a positive relationship in difficult times.

Why is important?

The theme of Resilience plays a very important role in achieving the project's objectives. What we want to achieve by working on the value of resilience is to somehow provide participants with the necessary tools and skills to face and overcome the problems and challenges in their lives. This is how this contributes directly to personal development and to strengthening the participants' ability to handle difficult situations, learn from them and move forward.

Resilience is also closely related to social inclusion, because it somehow allows individuals to overcome barriers and obstacles, they may face due to their situation of marginalization or exclusion. If we get participants to develop the value of resilience through the project, they will be able to face challenges related to social exclusion, discrimination, stigma or lack of opportunities.

Resilience will help them find ways to overcome these barriers and participate fully in society. This value is closely related to empowerment, as it is committed to the ability to take control of one's own life and in turn, overcome difficulties actively and effectively.

The project empowers them to face and overcome the challenges that may arise in their lives, which consequently strengthens their sense of self-efficacy and ability to influence their environment. Using storytelling methodology, the project not only helps participants develop their own coping skills, but also fosters the creation of a "community of support" in which participants can share their experiences, provide mutual support and learn from each other. EQUALITY

ACTIVE CITIZENSHIP

The concept of active citizenship implies citizens' interest in participating in the public and political life of the country. There are two fundamental factors in developing good active citizenship, education and participation. Education is indeed fundamental, no individual can properly contribute to the betterment of the country if he does not know the founding values of his nation, how can one vote with awareness if he is not aware of his form of government? Participation is just as important, it is the direct way in which citizens can express their consensus or dissent, yet this tool is sometimes neglected, a clear example of which can be found in the data from the last elections in Italy, where only 63.91% of those eligible exercised their vote. This rate, which is the lowest ever recorded in the country, increases a climate of mistrust that sees citizens increasingly inactive and resigned to their fate.

Active citizenship can then be examined in four main dimensions:

- The political dimension of citizenship refers to political rights and responsibilities towards the state.
- The social dimension refers to behaviors related to the interaction between individuals, driven by sound and shared values.
- The cultural dimension of citizenship refers to the awareness of a common cultural heritage.
- The economic dimension refers to all actions taken by an individual with the aim of contributing to his or her own livelihood and that of the country.

Why is important?

A core value for developing the project's activities and objectives is Active Citizenship focuses on promoting the civic and political participation of participants, as well as strengthening their capacity to influence society and contribute to positive social change, which in turn can contribute significantly to the personal development, social inclusion and Active Citizenship of participants.

DEMOCRACY

The word democracy derives from the Greek ' $\delta\eta\mu\sigma$ ' meaning people and ' $\kappa\rho\dot{\alpha}\tau\sigma$ ' meaning power, literally 'government by the people'. The concept has obviously undergone a great evolution over the years, widening more and more the range of people who are allowed to participate directly or indirectly in political life. It is important to emphasize that understanding democracy as a value means realizing that living in a democratic state entails many rights but just as many duties. First and foremost, there is the duty to participate in public life. Indeed, numerous historical experiences show that it is not enough to create democratic institutions in order to generate a democracy, but that citizens must have an interest in the development of democracy.

An important distinction is that between direct and representative democracy. The former is based on systems that allow citizens to decide directly on an issue, for example through a referendum. The second, on the other hand, consists of citizens exercising their right to vote, thus placing the choice in the hands of politicians; in this case, the risk is that citizens may vote influenced by political propaganda and not on the basis of their own ideas, as cases of former comedians coming to power are not new.

Why is important?

Democracy is one of the most important values that could be addressed in this project, since the promotion of Democracy seeks to promote civic and political participation of the participants, as well as to strengthen their understanding of democratic principles and their ability to influence the political process, which in turn can contribute significantly to personal development, social inclusion and active citizenship of the participants.

Problem solving is a transversal competence that is of fundamental importance in today's labour market. The most common problem-solving method involves four stages:

- Identifying the problem: This phase seems the simplest, but in reality, it is more complex than you might think, because very often the real problem is not the apparent problem.
- Generating alternatives: In this step the subject generates a number of possible solutions to the problem.
- Evaluate solutions: This part consists of drawing up a risk/benefit ratio for each solution and choosing the one that is most appropriate.
- Implementation: The last step is expressed by the implementation of the chosen solution.

Why is important?

Problem Solving is one of the most important values for this project as it seeks to strengthen participants' abilities to effectively confront and resolve obstacles. Problem Solving is an important skill in everyday life and in the workplace.
